INTERNET SOCIETY GHANA CHAPTER TO ORGANIZE FIRST ‘AfNOG TRACK E0 LOCALIZATION’ WORKSHOP ON UNIX SYSTEM ADMINISTRATION AT UNIVERSITY OF CAPE COAST

Cape Coast, Ghana 29th May, 2009: The Internet Society (ISOC) Ghana Chapter and partner organizations is organising its first ‘AfNOG Track E0 Localization’ (Unix Systems Administration) Workshop at the University of in Cape Coast in Ghana. The Workshop, which comes off from **26th July to 30th July 2009** is targeted at IT personnel working in industry, government, tertiary institutions and non-profit organizations is set to enhance the chances of prospective participants of attending the Track 1 and 2 of the annual AfNOG workshops held in various venues in Africa.

The workshop is also aimed at building the capacities of IT personnel in Unix Systems Administration in Ghana. The initiative to localize ‘AfNOG E0’ in African countries is being spearheaded by the Internet Society. Internet Society, Ghana Chapter, in furtherance of this noble objective is facilitating the first workshop, which will be taken over by the Ghana Network Operators Group (ghNOG) for future workshops. ‘E0 Localization’ workshops will be organized twice yearly in July and December/January.

On Friday, **July 31 2009** there will be an Annual General Meeting of the Ghana Network Operators Group (ghNOG), when the group will be officially inaugurated.

The goal of AfNOG is to share experience of technical challenges in setting up, building and running IP networks on the African continent. 
